Top 5 Sights in Salzburg Old Town



MIRABELL GARDEN

The garden complex in the middle of the city of Salzburg offers impressive perspectives, views, plays of colors and shapes.

The variety of plants, the mixture of open, busy and shady, quiet areas inspire locals and guests from all over the world again and again.

The famous gardens of Mirabell Palace are a "real" garden monument.

SALZBURG CATHEDRAL

Salzburg Cathedral is the cathedral of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Salzburg and thus the metropolitan church of the ecclesiastical province of Salzburg. Opened during the Thirty Years' War, the Baroque building is a listed monument and is part of the UNESCO World Heritage Historic Center of the City of Salzburg.





HOHENSALZBURG FORTRESS

The Hohensalzburg Fortress is a real eye-catcher high above the baroque towers of the city. As a landmark visible from afar, the fortress is an unmistakable part of Salzburg's world-famous silhouette. It appears mighty to visitors from afar, and history can be experienced up close behind its thick walls.

MOZART BIRTHPLACE

The house where Wolfgang Amadé Mozart was born on January 27, 1756, is now one of the most visited museums in the world. No other

place makes the person behind the artist Wolfgang Amadé Mozart and his music as tangible as his birthplace.





ST. PETER'S CEMETERY

St. Peter's has to be one of the most beautiful cemeteries in the world. Located in the cliffs of the Mönchsberg, it has catacombs dating back to the 12th century and is always filled with bright, fresh flowers thanks to the locals who tend the graves. The cemetery was used by some of the noblest families in Salzburg and there are numerous vaults around the perimeter of the cemetery, many of which are locked behind wrought iron gates.
